1. OUTCOMES BASED APPROACH

- 1. Is it clear how better design outcomes will be delivered using an outcomes focussed approach?
- 2. Do you have any ideas to improve the new planning system and make it easier to navigate and engage with?

2. DISTRICT STRATEGIES

- 3. Which District Strategy and which suburbs do you wish to provide comment on?
- 4. For example-"The Inner South District Strategy for the suburbs of Yarralumla and/or Deakin"
- 5. Is the character of your district reflected well in the district strategy?
- 6. Do the proposed initiatives reflect your aspirations for your district?
- 7. All districts will need to change to fit in our future population. Do you think the proposed areas of change provide for new homes and local shop revitalisations in your district?

3. TERRITORY PLAN

- 8. Is the manner in which the Territory Plan will give effect to the ACT Planning Strategy and the District Strategies, in concert with the other policies including climate change and the Urban Forest Bill 2022 clear?
- 9. Does the proposed draft Territory Plan help make the new "outcomes based" planning system easier to navigate and engage with?
